DR. NURMAZILAH DATO' MAHZAN

Dr. Nurmazilah is the Chief Executive Officer of Malaysian Institute of Accountants and was previously the MIA Deputy Chief Executive Officer. Prior to MIA, she was Director of the University Malaya Graduate School of Business.

She started her career with Arthur Andersen in 1993, and later joined KUB Malaysia Berhad as Group Accounts Manager. Her corporate experience covers various industries including property development and construction, banking, unit trusts, trading and manufacturing. She was a MIA Council member, a Member of the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board, elected member of Board of Governors for the Institute of Internal Auditors Malaysia, Council member of The Malaysian Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and Honorary Treasurer with Persatuan Ekonomi Malaysia. She also served in various committees of MIA and MICPA. She holds a PhD in accounting from University of Birmingham, UK. She has conducted various research projects in the areas of auditing, financial reporting and corporate governance.



PROFESSOR DR. DAVID ASIRVATHAM

Prof. Dr. David Asirvatham is the Chair of the MIA Digital Transformation Implementation Committee, Principle 3 Working Group-Academia. In the academic arena, he is currently the Executive Dean of the Faculty of Innovation & Technology, Head

of the School of Computing and IT, and leads the Data Analytics, Modelling and Visualisation Research Cluster at Taylor's University. His area of expertise includes Neural Network, E-Learning, ICT Project Management, Multimedia Content Development and Big Data Analytics. He has been lecturing as well as managing ICT projects for the past 25 years. He had previously served as Director, Centre of Information Technology at University of Malaya; Associate Dean, Faculty of Information Technology and member of the Finance Committee at Multimedia University; Project Manager, Multimedia and IT Infrastructure Development for a university campus; sits on the SAP Advisory Council; and a Consultant for e-University Project.

She also worked with university partners to ensure the delivery of university partner programmes adhered to the academic quality and rigour as stipulated by the university partners. Esther has a degree in accountancy, is a Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) and holds a Masters in Social Sciences (Applied Economics).



LEE SOO FERN


